- Explain to students that they are going to practice recognizing character traits.
 - Character traits describe a character's personality. Character traits are important to identify because they help students understand who a character is through their actions, words, emotions, and body language. This allows students to understand a character's motivation and analyze their actions within a story.
- Have students think about the main characters in one of the Adventures Series readaloud books. Use the following questions as a guide to explore character traits.
 - What emotions did they display?
 - How did they interact with other characters?
 - Why was the character behaving or feeling that way?
 - If you had to choose one word to describe the character, what would it be? Explain why with evidence from the text.
 - If you could suggest a new action, emotion, or behavior that the character should display, what would it be?
- Next, have students complete All About My Character.
